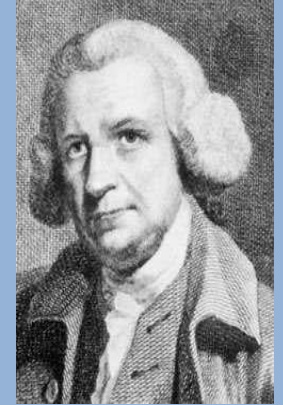

ICE's Royal Charter, first granted by King George IV on 3 June, 1828



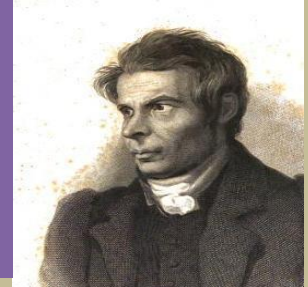

1839, the organisation moved into premises in Great George Street in the heart of Westminster , (After Telford’s death in 1834) began publishing learned papers...

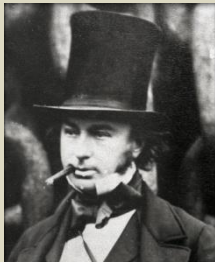
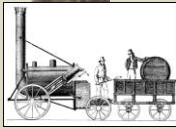
By the end of the 19th century, ICE had introduced examinations for professional engineering qualifications...
