The Annual General Meeting for Members of the Western Canada Group of Chartered Engineers took place on **Wednesday January 29 at the Royal Vancouver Yacht Club, 3811 Point Grey Road, Vancouver, B.C.** The meeting commenced at 5:20 p.m. and adjourned at 6:05, followed at 7:00 p.m. by a Dinner Reception.

MINUTES OF MEETING

2. Adoption of the 2015 Agenda: The Agenda was adopted without changes or additions.
3. Approval of Minutes of the last AGM held on January 29, 2014, **Appendix A** to the Agenda. The Minutes were approved on proposal of Arul Raja and Seconded by Matthew Walton-Knight, and thus carried.

6. Adoption of the Group Officers' reports: Following questions and discussion, all the reports were accepted unanimously, on proposal by Matthew Walton-Knight and seconded by Arul Raja.

8. Nomination for the Election of the 2014 Group Committee:

APPENDIX AA – Summary of KEYNOTE ADDRESS BY ROBIN SILVESTER C.ENG P.ENG Jan 28, 2015

OVERVIEW OF PORT METRO VANCOUVER, Facilitating Our Nations Trade.

As the CEO of Port Metro Vancouver (PMV) Mr. Robin Silvester explained the mission of PMV under its Federal mandate is to lead the growth of Canada's Pacific gateway to the well-being of Canadians by connecting Canada with the global economy. Under a New Canada Building Plan of \$53B over 10 years started in 2014, the key objectives are provisioning of safe and environmentally sustainable marine infrastructure vital to the supply chain .in a financially self-sufficient manner. Supply chain components include labour, trains, trucking, vessels and terminals. A Smart Fleet GPS-based tracking system for trucks has been implemented to track the movement of truck cargo anywhere in Canada in real time.

The Vancouver Port is Canada's largest and the fourth largest port in North America. Daily twenty percent of Canada's international trade with 160 countries flows through, worth \$500M/day while supporting 100,000 jobs in Canada. Almost half of the trade is with Asia-Pacific countries.

The PMV invested in development of the operating regional capacity, notably the following major capital projects around the lower mainland:

Regional federal road network: Port Mann Bridge and South Fraser Perimeter road (\$5B) and replacement of the Massey Tunnel at \$1B.

Major trade areas being upgraded currently at \$700M include six projects on the North Shore and two on the South Shore of the Burrard inlet. In the south-west upgrades include Deltaport Third Berth and the Robert Banks trade area.

Future investments on the table include the Fraser River Rail capacity and the Roberts Bank Terminal 2.

The PMV also invests in related private sector expansions. Along the shores of the Burrard investments are made in a number of private projects, including Seaspam, Neptune, Richardson-International and others at a total of near \$1.2B. Along the Fraser River six companies including the Vancouver Airport Fuel Delivery Project attracted investment exceeding \$0.5B. Roberts Bank T2 private sector investment is in the order of \$2 to \$3B. Mr. Silvester continued with an overview of projects, referring to projected container traffic growth up to 2030. The Low-Case Throughput is 6 Million TEUs and the High Case is estimated at 8.5M TEU. Noteworthy are The Roberts Bank terminal 2 future project. For 2.4 M TEUs, construction to commence in 2017 and completion by 2024.

About environmental issues of marine and river developments Mr. Silvester emphasized that sustainable environmental protection is of critical priority. As an example he referred to the very successful salt marsh restoration along Boundary Bay. The need to balance efficient port operations with community concerns is fully recognized by PMV.

The event was attended by 43 members and guests.

HONORARY TREASURER’S REPORT 2014

The Financial Profit and Loss Statement from January 1st to December 31st, 2014 forms part of this financial report.

The Financial Statement is a consolidated summary of the General Ledger. The Ledger includes all entries for payments made by cheques for invoices received by the Honorary Treasurer and approved by the WCGCE Committee 2014. The Ledger also includes Grants received from UK parent institutions, Revenue generated from the 2013 AGM ticket sales, BBQ ticket sales, contributions from other institutions for joint Technical Meetings, interest earned on current balance held in the bank account, and interest earned on Term Deposit. All Ledger entries have been balanced at the end of each month against the monthly bank statements.

The 2014 Audit Committee, comprises Mr. David Crook and Mr. Roger Nathan, having examined the Ledger against all Vouchers, Invoices, and Grants representing 2014 transactions, deemed the financial position of the Western Canada Group of Chartered Engineers to be correct. The Audit Committee approved the Financial Statement on January 13, 2015.

Comparison of 2014 and 2013 incomes show a significant increase of about 47% with respect to 2013. It should be noted that a significant portion of the 2013 Grants (in the amount of \$11,534.50) was paid in January 2014. However, the final payment of the 2014 Grants from the parent institutions in the amount of \$8,013.00 was not received at the time of preparing this report. The income earned from the 2014 AGM ticket sales and BBQ tickets sales including a contribution from the ASME/SEABC towards a joint Technical Meeting were reduced by approximately 13% with respect to 2013. The income earned from bank interest was lower as the bank interest was lower for 2014 with respect to 2013.

The overall spending in 2014 was significantly reduced by approximately 37% compared with 2013. This is attributed to the following:

1. Administration costs including support for preparing and editing the “Challenge” newsletters were significantly reduced by approximately 52% with respect to 2013 due to the production of the newsletter being published as shorter articles on a regular basis via the WCGCE website (prepared by the Honorary Secretary) in place of bi-annual newsletters.
2. Payment for the 2013 UBC awards in the amount of \$1,500.00 was made in April 2014 following consultation with the WCGCE Committee. The Committee further deliberated whether further contributions should be made to the UBC awards and whether contributions should considered for other similar awards. The annual budget for the UBC awards in previous years was \$3,000.00.

3. Adopting the strategy initially implemented in April 2013, communication with Members has been through the dedicated WCGCE website and through digitized notices, newsletters and emails. The communication expenses (including printing and postage costs) have significantly decreased by approximately 96% with respect to 2013.
4. Due to delayed receipt of invoices for 2013, payments for 2013 and 2014 liability insurances (\$1,354.00 for 2013 and \$1,368.00 for 2014) occurred in January and December 2013, respectively. Payment for 2015 liability insurance (\$1,382.00) was made in December 2014. A reduction of approximately 49% in costs associated with liability insurances with respect to 2013 was therefore noted.

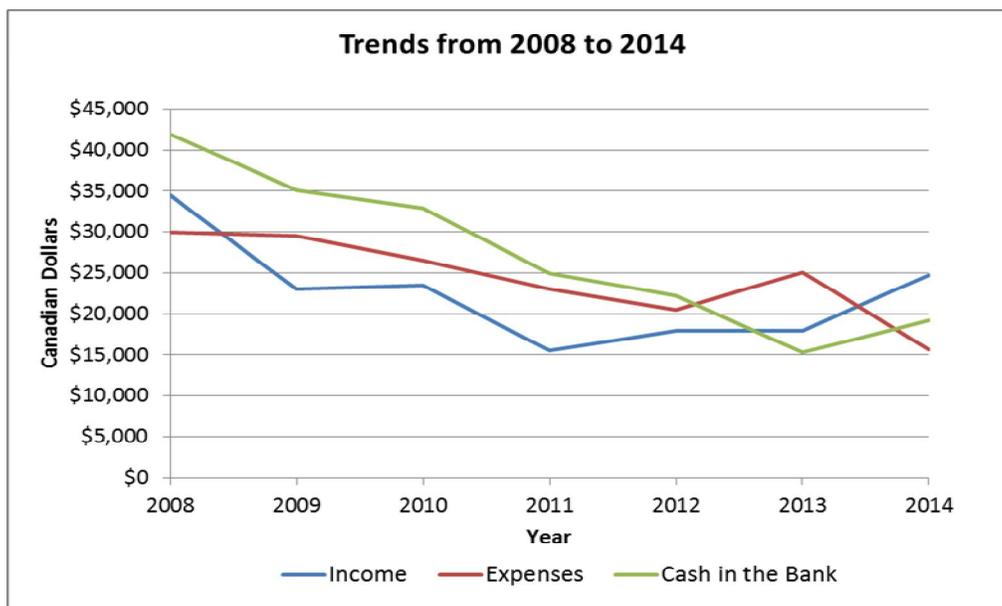

Notes:

1. The Grants received in 2014 included \$11,534.50 for 2013 funds, \$9,987.00 for 2014 funds and \$570.00 for BBQ ticket sales contribution. The remaining Grants for 2014, in the amount of \$8,013.00 were not received at the time of preparing this report.
2. Income from other deposits consisted of contributions from ASME/SEABC towards a joint Technical Meeting held on September 17, 2014, in the amount of \$323.05, and bank interests transferred from the cashable account, in the amount of \$84.82.
3. As indicated earlier in this report, substantial savings were made for administration costs due to the production of the "Challenge" newsletters being revised to shorter articles published digitally on a regular basis.
4. As indicated earlier in this report, a reduced payment of \$1,500.00 for the 2013 UBC awards was approved by the WCGCE Committee, following consultation in 2014.

5. As indicated earlier in this report, due to the digitization of notices and newsletters, and electronic communication with Members, substantial savings associated with printing and postage costs were realized in 2014. The remaining communication costs for 2014 were associated with a one-off transfer fee for the WCGCE website domain and six-month website maintenance fees.
6. As indicated earlier in this report, an annual payment was made for the 2015 liability insurance in December 2014.
7. Disbursements for Technical/Business Meetings marginally increased by about 2% in 2014 with respect to 2013 due to additional costs associated with gift cards presented to the 2014 AGM speakers (in the amount of \$200.00).



The above graph depicts Income, Expenses, and Cash flow trends between 2008 and 2014. With the exception of 2014, the general trend since 2008 indicates a steady decline in the amount of Cash in the Bank, which was concurrent with the general decline in the Annual Income received. The amount of Cash in the Bank for 2014 was significantly higher compared with previous years due to an increase in funds received (combination of funds for 2013 that was given in January 2014 and partial funds for 2014), as well as a significant reduction in expenses.

During the same period, the general trend of the expenses has been declining with the exception of 2013. It should be noted that the WCGCE has continued to adopt strategies that were initially implemented in mid-2013 for reducing expenditures in 2015 without reducing services to Members. The strategies implemented include maintaining the WCGCE website and continuing to digitize notices, newsletters and regular reports instead of posting printed documents, as well as preparing shorter regular newsletter articles in place of bi-annual newsletters.

The group enters 2015 with sufficient funds to continue operations for another year.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Audit Committee comprising of Mr. David Crook and Mr. Roger Nathan for their participation in the financial audit, as well as the WCGCE Chair, Mr. Andrzej Nawrocki and the

WCGCE Honorary Secretary, Mr. George De Ridder for their review of the financial statements and the financial report.

Notes

1. The data base is updated ongoing from communications with local members or acquaintances, for example recording deceased members and address changes. The numbers may not be spot accurate, because they are based on available data as received from the London institutions from time-to-time. Only IstructE have provided current lists during the last quarter. Apparently some institutions can't provide name lists broken out for the WCGCE geographical areas and we have to rely on local communications with members. Our administrative assistant, Carine De Ridder, tracks email addresses that return as 'undeliverable' on notices of technical events that are emailed.
2. The Hon Secretary requests members to notify him as soon as possible of any changes in status of address and membership.

Correspondence of Group

- i) **London:** Email correspondence was conducted regarding budget and money tranche business through Mary Weeks, International Member Development Coordinator on behalf of all the institutions; Mary works through the office of IMechE
- ii) **UBC:** We received a report from the Awards Coordinator at UBC on the three award recipients of the 2013-14 term (**See Appendix E-1 attached**). Three students received \$500 each from our \$1,500 pledge.

- iii) **Newsletter:** The group published three Newsletters replacing the Challenge during 2013. The letters are edited by Chris Richardson and content provides short summaries of presentations at all the technical meetings. Newsletters can be read on our website www.wcgce.org
- iv) **Website:** Our new website has been received very well; it is regularly kept up-to-date with notices and reports of events, portraying a positive the face of the Group activities. Members can link to all the Institutions and local professional bodies, browse past events and future events, and contact the Committee. The web site is under direction of the Hon Secretary with assistance from an independent contractor (Stephen Pienaar) to manage the day-to-day upkeep of the site. During April we switched from Geohost to *Anno Internet Ltd* for web hosting and domain services.

Committee Meetings

The Committee convened formally six times during 2014. Meetings were conducted with a quorum in attendance and lead by the Chairman Andrzej Nawrocki (IET). An Agenda and Previous Minutes were distributed in advance of meetings, and the written Minutes were tabled for review and acceptance at the following meeting. All approved Minutes are available on request.

REPORT ON TECHNICAL PROGRAM 2014

Technical Events – Presentations (schedule on p. 2)

The Committee presented six events during 2014 attended by 228 persons, including the AGM in January.

A balanced range of interesting subjects were presented, all of relevance to the spread of engineering disciplines represented by the Group. The quality of content and presentation skills were without exception most satisfactory and entertaining, often with lively participations from the floor.

One topic was on philosophy of engineering approach, two events discussed technical topics and one event was on energy options related to environmental science and issues

On the social side, there were two events: annual dinner following the AGM in January; and the garden barbeque held jointly with APEG-Sea-To-Sky in July. Guest speakers at the AGM include the President of APEGBC, Mr. Mike Bapty as well as Ann English the CEO of APEGBC

Attendance of the technical program varies between 12 and 64. On average, 5% of our members regularly attend the events, however two joint events with ASME (Dynamic Theatre Seating in September) and the SEABC (Christchurch Earthquake presented in June) significantly increased attendance to a peak of 64. These organizations have expressed enthusiasm for joint events and we look forward to continue seeking for joint event opportunities.

An honorarium of \$100 was presented to speakers, which some speakers have kindly donated to WCGCE.

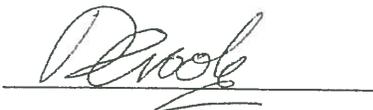

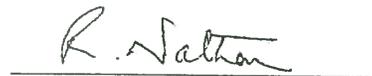
